

- Objective: support countries in planning the preparation of their first biennial transparency report











Current Framework Future Framework

What do we need this tool for?

- Ensure a smooth transition from reporting BURs to BTRs
- Guide the design and set-up of the transparency system underpinning the BTR process
- Get an orientation of the time required for the BTR implementation





How does this tool work?

- 1) Six main steps
- 2) Guidance and recommendations to improve the quality of the process over time
- 3) Questions posed to check national circumstances and reporting capacity
- 4) Elaboration of a country-driven roadmap (time based on assumptions)





Main elements of the tool


Stocktaking: help countries map out what the current in-country reporting arrangements are

ETF Requirements Mapping: guide countries to understand the new requirements and planning for the BTR implementation

Roadmap generation: provides a summary of the necessary steps leading up to the BTR with <u>indicative</u> required time period to complete capacity development needed









Six steps to get ready



Setting the scene and appointing the BTR coordination team



Taking stock of current MRV arrangements



Planning phase



Implementation



Preparing for the technical expert review



Improvement over time






What's next?
